



The Diversity Forum will be held at 1:30 p.m. – 2:30 p.m. ET, Sunday, May 16, 2021. Please see page 23 for more details.


The Women's Forum will be held at 4:30 p.m. – 5:30 p.m. ET Saturday, May 15, 2021. Please see page 24 for more details.

The AJRCCM, AJRCMB, and Annals ATS will have a combined session on Monday, May 17, 2021. These workshops provide attendees the opportunity to receive firsthand advice from our Editors on how to be a successful peer reviewer as well as how to get involved with the ATS Journals family.

Amberson Lecture

The Amberson Lecture recognizes a career of major international lifetime contributions to clinical or basic pulmonary research and/ or clinical practice, and recognizes exemplary professionalism, collegiality and citizenship through mentorship and leadership in the ATS community. The Lecture is given in honor of James Burns Amberson, an international authority on chest disease and tuberculosis.

Recognition Awards for Scientific Accomplishments

The Recognition Award for Scientific Accomplishments recognizes outstanding scientific contributions in basic or clinical research to enhance the understanding, prevention and treatment of respiratory disease or critical illness, and recognizes exemplary professionalism, collegiality and citizenship through mentorship and leadership in the ATS community. Awardees are selected based on contributions made throughout their careers or for major contributions made at a particular point in their careers.

Trudeau Medal

The Trudeau Medalist is an individual with lifelong major contributions to prevention, diagnosis and treatment of lung disease through leadership in research, education, or clinical care. This award acknowledges exemplary professionalism, collegiality and citizenship in the ATS community. The Trudeau Medal was established in 1926 and is given in honor of Edward Livingston Trudeau, a founder and the first president of the American Lung Association.

Distinguished Achievement Award

The Distinguished Achievement Award recognizes outstanding contribution(s) to fighting pulmonary disease, critical illness and sleep disorders through research, education, patient care, or advocacy and acknowledges exemplary professionalism, collegiality and citizenship in lung health and the research community.

When the members of the MITT Committee first met, we realized there was a lot about the ATS that we didn't know. To make the ATS more accessible, we created the ATS 101 section. We hope this section will give you some ideas on how you can become more active within the organization.

How does the ATS work?

The ATS is a member-driven organization, meaning that all decisions are effectively made by members. The day-to-day function of the ATS relies on a dedicated staff of more than 90 employees, who work in offices in New York and Washington, D.C. The Society's leadership is represented by an Executive Committee comprised of the executive director and five elected officers.

Each year, the Society's Nominating Committee selects two candidates from solicited nominations and then the membership votes for who should become the next Secretary-Treasurer. The election results are announced in the ATS News and other Society communications in April.

Why should I get involved in the ATS?

As an ATS member, you can have a direct impact on pulmonary, critical care, and sleep medicine both nationally and internationally. Active members help the Society to develop statements and guidelines, create new educational programs, prioritize content for existing activities and guide the political voice of the ATS.

ATS leaders are actively soliciting the voice of junior members, so the best time to get involved is now!

What are the Assemblies?

The 14 ATS Assemblies and three sections are at the heart of the Society's mission. Through these groups, ATS members review, analyze and disseminate the latest basic science, translational, and clinical information. How can I be more involved during the **International Conference?**

> International Conference programming, for the most part, is driven by ATS Assemblies. Each Assembly is allotted a specific number of slots for each type of session and its Program Committee ranks various submissions. A direct way to be a part of the conference is to submit your own symposium suggestion to the appropriate assembly during the "Call for Input" period, which takes place immediately after the conference. To increase the chances of acceptance, ask the assembly program committee chair and/or its members for advice.

Remember, you shouldn't be discouraged by rejection. Assemblies often receive many submissions for only a few symposia slots. Get feedback and try again. Persistence pays off!

Where can I access CME?

The ATS is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME) to provide continuing medical education for physicians. The designation of AMA PRA Category 1 Credits™ per session will be available in May on the conference website. Physicians should only claim the credit commensurate with the extent of their participation in the activity. 
